WHEREAS, W. B. Long, W. H. Wilson, Mrs. E. L. Long, W. H. Wallace and S. E. Adams

did on the 25th day of January, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is W. B. Long & Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is merchandise, own, buy and sell cotton, engage in the business of cotton brokerage; own, buy, sell and otherwise deal in real and personal property; engage in manufacture of cotton goods products and by products; borrow and lend money, mortgage and/or pledge real and/or personal property; execute any and all contracts or bonds; engage generally in any business enterprise.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00)

payable on demand Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Thousand (2000)

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 1st day of January, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

W. B. Long, W. H. Wilson, Mrs. E. L. Long, W. H. Wallace and S. E. Adams

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. B. Long

as Vice-President, W. H. Wilson; as Secretary, R. L. Hipp

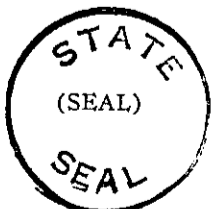
as Treasurer, R. L. Hipp

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
