CHARTER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

WHEREAS, J. M. Perry and C. M. Gaffney, Jr. both of Greenville, S. C. did on the 28th day of January, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is Wilco, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To manufacture, fashion, design, purchase, knit, sew, repair, mend, fabricate, import, export, contract ofr the manufacture, purchase and sale of, and to sell at wholesale or retail, or in any other manner deal in or with men's wearing apparel of every class and description, and all materials constituting a part of such men's wearing apparel or entering into the manufacture thereof; to provide, own, maintain, sell, lease, mortgage, convey, improve and in all ways use and operate factories, plants, machinery, equipment, works and facilities, generally for manufacturing, selling and handling of weraing apparel of every class and description.

To manufacture, purchase, or otherwise acquire, own, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign and transfer, or otherwise dispose of, to invest, trade, deal in and deal with, goods, wares and merchandise and personal property of every class and description.

To acquire, and pay for in cash, stock or bonds of this corporation or otherwise, the good will, rights, assets and property, and to undertake or assume the whole or any part of the obligations or liabilities of any person, firm association or corporation.

To acquire, hold, use, sell, assign, lease, grant licenses in respect of, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of letters patent of the United States or any foreign country, patent rights, licenses and privileges, inventions, improvements and processes, copyrights, trademarks and trade-names relating to or useful in connection with any business of this corporation.

To purchase, hold, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock of or any bonds, securities or evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation or corporations organized under the laws of this state or any other state, country, nation or government, and while the owner thereof to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote.

To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description with any person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, county, state, body politic or government or colony or dependency thereof.

To borrow money for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the corporation and from time to time, without limit as to amount, to make, accept, endorse and issue promissory notes, bonds and other evidences of debt and to secure the payment of any of its obligarions by mortgage or deed in trust on all or any of its property and franchises, both real and personal.

To have one or more offices, to carry on all or any of its operations and business and without restriction or limit as to amount to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, own, mortgage, sell convey, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description in South Carolina and any of the States, Districts, Territories or Colonies of the United States, and in any and all foreign countries, subject to the laws of such State, District, Territory, Colony or Country.

In general, to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing, whether manufacturing or otherwise, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of South Carolina upon corporations formed under the act hereinafter referred to, and to do any or all things hereinbefore set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do.

The objects and purposes specified in the foregoing clauses shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from, the
