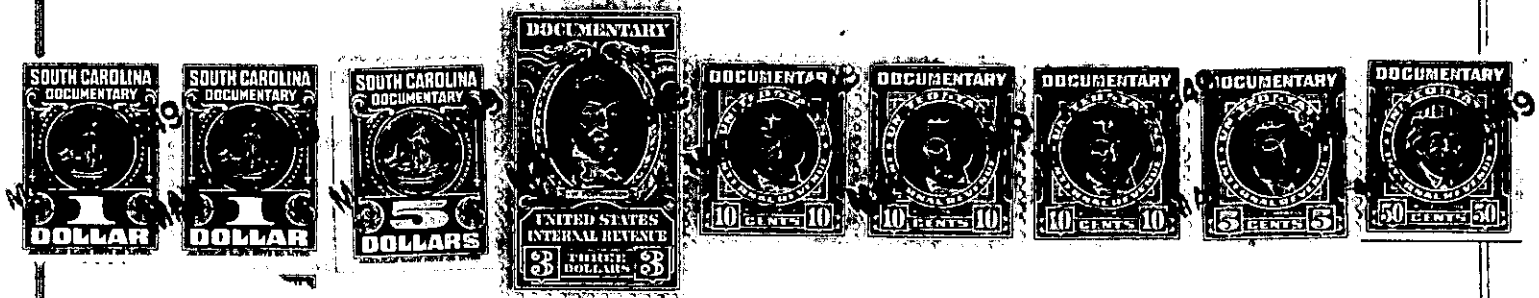

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That WE, MAX RUMPF AND EMILY D. RUMPF,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED & NO/100 (\$3,500.00) Dollars,
to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by FINLEY JAMESON

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FINLEY JAMESON, his Heirs and Assigns, forever:-

in Saluda Township

All that piece, parcel or lot of land/containing 52 acres, according to survey made by W. A. Adams, Surveyor, December 19, 1918, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at an old Sweet Gum Stump on Bank of Mush Creek, thence N. 33-45 E. 22.40 chains to an iron pin in hedge row; thence S. 70-15 W. 12.82 chains to an iron pin in road; thence N. 45-30 W. 6 chains to iron pin in old road; thence S. 88-45 W. 12.50 chains to an iron pin in Mush Creek Road; thence S. 30-30 W. 3.50 chains to an angle in road; thence N. 28-45 W. 3.35 chains to stake in branch; thence N. 13 W. 4.50 chains to a willow; thence N. 31 E. 2 chains to a bend in branch; thence N. 27-30 E. 3.86 chains to bend in branch; thence N. 74 E. 5.20 chains to bend in Panther Fork; thence N. 82 E. 4.75 chains to bend in creek; thence N. 71 E. 3 chains to bridge over Mush Creek; thence N. 82-30 E. 6.50 chains to the beginning corner.

The above described property is the identical property conveyed to the Grantors herein by Roy D. Williams by deed dated September 30, 1947, and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Volume 322 at Page 272.
