

BEGINNING on a locust near a large rock and running thence S. 75 W. 17.50 chains to a stake X on southwest face of Big Rock in southeast slope of Hogback Mountain; thence S. $31\frac{1}{2}$ W. (this line running along impassable cliffs of rock) 31.00 chains to a hickory; thence N. 60 E. 25.00 chains to a poplar stump on line of fence; thence N. 5 W. 14.00 ch. to a chestnut oak stump; thence N. 24 E. 21.00 chains to the beginning corner, containing seventy-two (72) acres, more or less.

(2) All that tract of land in Glassy Mountain Township on Jamison's Mill Creek of South Pacolet River, containing 128 acres, more or less, and being described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake on said creek, on the line of D. L. Bellew land above described, and running thence S. 77 E. 36.00 chains to a poplar; thence N. 86 E. 16.00 chains to a chestnut oak; thence N. 61 E. 31 chains to a maple; thence S. 76 E. 9.85 chains to a stake; thence N. 77 E. 18 chains to a chestnut oak; thence N. $11\frac{1}{2}$ W. to Jamison's Mill Creek; thence up the said creek to the beginning corner.

(3) All that tract in Glassy Mountain Township on branch waters of Jamison's Mill Creek of South Pacolet River, containing 75 acres, more or less, described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at a chestnut on Altston Ballew's corner, and running thence N. $37\frac{1}{2}$ E. 36.00 chains to a white oak; thence N. $71\frac{1}{2}$ W. 10.00 chains to a white oak; thence with line of the Luther R. Fischer land S. 73 W. 31.14 ch. to a black oak; thence N. 68 W. 7.00 chains to a stake; thence S. 80 W. 3.00 chains to two pines; thence S. 47 E. 37.00 chains to the beginning corner.

(4) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township on Jamison's Mill Creek of South Pacolet River, containing 68 acres, more or less, and described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at a stone on the south bank of said creek and running thence due west to a sourwood; thence about southwest to a stone; thence N. 6 W. to a chestnut; thence N. 42 W. 13.78 chains to a chestnut oak on corner of the F. M. Gosnell land above described; thence with line of said Gosnell land N. $11\frac{1}{2}$ W. to Jamison's Mill Creek; thence down the said creek to the beginning corner.
