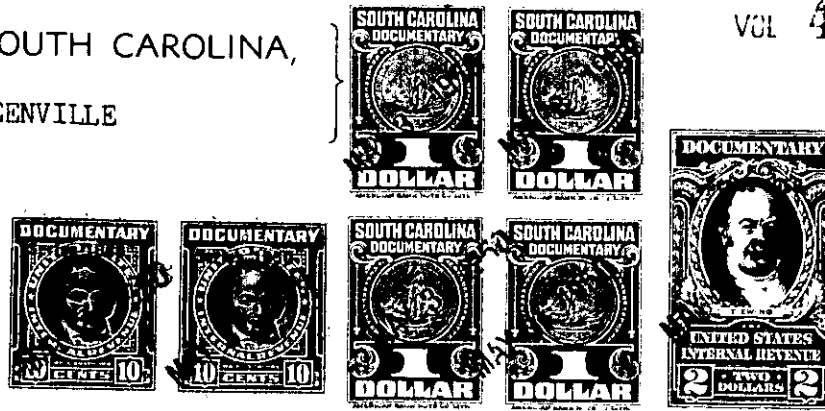

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Ralph Massey and Katherine H. Massey
and their heirs and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, and being described according to a plat of the
property of J. M. Black, made by J. C. Hill, Engineer, on January 16, 1949,
as follows:

BEGINNING at a nail cap at the Southeastern intersection of the
Hunts Bridge Road and Rutledge Lake Road and running thence with said Rut-
ledge Lake Road, S. 43-15 W., 209.9 feet to a nail cap; thence S. 52-30 E.,
286.3 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 17-45 E., 248.2 feet to a nail cap on
the Hunts Bridge Road; thence with the said Hunts Bridge Road, N. 62-45 W.,
183.3 feet to the beginning corner, containing 1.23 acres, more or less.

The Grantees assume and agree to pay the balance due of eight hun-
