

PARCEL - 67: All that certain tract, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being on the headwaters of North Saluda River, in Glassy Mountain Township, conveyed by R. E. Johnston unto Border State Lumber Company, as containing 63 acres, more or less, under two separate deeds, bearing date, respectively, Sept. 12, 1904 and Feb. 7, 1908, recorded in the said R. M. C. Office in Deed Book MMM, at page 147 et seq. and Deed Book YYY, at page 447 et seq. Said tract being out of the original Templeton-Wheeler Grants, which passed unto Peter Gosnell and is part of a tract of 150 acres conveyed by said Peter Gosnell unto Rachel Summey, by deed dated May 27, 1872, recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book LLL, at page 424, under date of Feb. 26, 1904, and passed from Rachel Summey by deed unto C. A. Gosnell, who by his deed dated April 22, 1904, recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book LLL, at page 701, did pass title thereto unto the said R. E. Johnston.

PARCEL - 68: All that piece, parcel or tract of land, on branch waters of North Saluda River, in Glassy Mountain Township, conveyed to Border State Lumber Company by R. E. Johnston, as containing 40 acres, more or less, under two separate deeds dated, respectively, Sept. 12, 1904 and Feb. 7, 1908, recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book MMM, at page 147, and Deed Book YYY, at page 447, et seq, and to the said R. E. Johnston conveyed April 4, 1904, by William Howard, under deed recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book LLL, at page 697.

ALSO: All that piece, parcel or tract of land, adjoining the tract last above described, situate, lying and being on branch waters of North Saluda River, in Glassy Mountain Township, conveyed to Border State Lumber Company by R. E. Johnston, as containing 40 acres, more or less, under deed of conveyance bearing date of Sept. 12, 1904, recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book MMM, at page 147 et seq; and to the said R. E. Johnston conveyed April 4, 1904, by J. C. Prewett, by deed recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book LLL, at page 695. The land last above described in two separate tracts being cut of the old "Templeton Grant", and the same conveyed as one tract of 80 acres by James Gosnell unto Calvin Howard, Jan. 10, 1880, by deed recorded in the said R.M.C. PARCEL - 69: All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being on Sink Hole Branch, waters of North Saluda River, in Glassy Mountain Township, generally known as the "Stations Peak" tract; conveyed unto Border State Lumber Company by R. E. Johnston, as containing 70 acres, more or less, under his two separate deeds dated, respectively, May 1, 1905 and Feb. 7, 1908, recorded in the said R. M. C. Office May 10, 1905, in Deed Book MMM, at page 404, and July 6, 1908, in Deed Book YYY, at page 447. Being part of a tract of land originally granted to Wilson McKinney, and by Mesne Conveyance passed to the said R. E. Johnston through conveyance from D. H. Means, J. E. Tindall, J. M. Quattlebaum and the heirs-at-law of William Wallace and James G. Gibbs, deceased, deeds recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book MMM, at pages 327 and 328.

PARCEL - 70: All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being on waters of Brushy Creek, Flat Branch and North Saluda River, in Glassy Mountain Township, and adjoining and lying to the South and West of Parcels Nos. 13 and 16 hereinbefore described, lands of C. A. Gosnell, Rufus Gosnell, et al, conveyed to Border State Lumber Company by R. E. Johnston, as containing 322-1/3
