Know All Men by These Presents:

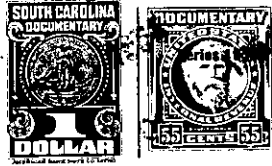
That I, Henry P. Willimon in the State aforesaid,

to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said WILLIAM J. BERRYHILL and daughter, EDNA M. BERRYHILL, their heirs and assigns, forever:

ALL that piece, parcel or lot of land being known and designated as Lot No. 174 of Conestee as shown by a plat thereof, made by Madison H. Woodward, Engineer, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. "T", at Pages 383 and 384; said Lot having the courses, distances, metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at joint front corners of Lots No. 174 and 173 and running thence along the line of said Lot No. 173, N. 89-31 W. 151.7 feet to an iron pin at back corner of Lot No. 154; thence along the rear line of said Lot No. 154, S. 0-29 W. 60 feet to iron pin at back corner of Lot No. 175; thence along the line of said Lot No. 175, S. 89-31 E. 174.2 feet to iron pin on East Pine Lake Circle; thence running with the said East Pine Lake Circle, N. 20-10 W. 63.8 feet to iron pin at point of beginning.

THAT the lands shall not be sold, rented or otherwise disposed of to any negro or person of African descent. No residence to cost less than Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars, shall be built on any lot unless said lot has fifty (50) feet, or more, frontage.



TOGETHER with all and Singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the said Premises before mentioned unto the grantee(s) hereinabove named, and their Heirs and Assigns forever.

And the grantor(s) do(es) hereby bind the grantor(s) and the grantor's(s) Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee(s) hereinabove named, and the grantee's(s) Heirs and Assigns against the grantor(s) and the grantor's(s) Heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
