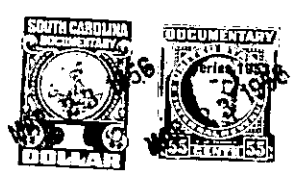
That we, WILLIS G. WELLMON and MALAGE B. WELLMON,
