Also, all that lot of land adjoining the above tract, beginning at a Sycamore stump under the North abutment of the McCauley bridge about west of the mill race to a stone; thence in a southerly direction to a stone near a Sweet Gum on J. E. Batson's line; thence in a easterly direction with Batson's line to Batson's and Bradley's corner in the swamp; thence with the Bradley line to a stone on Joe's line near the mill; thence with Joe's line to a sweet Gum; thence in a straight line to the beginning corner, containing 2.50 acres, more or less, and known as the McCauley Mill Place.

5. Also, all that lot of land beginning at a Sycamore stump under the north abutment of the McCauley bridge; thence with the public road in a northeasterly direction to W. L. Green line at a stone; thence about east with said W. L. Green's line to a stone on Joe's line to a Mulberry stump; thence with Joe's line to sweet Gum; thence in a straight line to the beginning corner, containing 2.0 acres, more or less.

EXCEPTING from the above lands conveyed, however, that one-half acre conveyed by W. E. McCauley to W. F. McCauley, by deed dated February 4, 1948, and recorded in Deed Book 370 at page 271 in the A. M. C. office for said Greenville County.

As a part of the consideration for this deed the grantee assumes the obligation to pay the balance due on that certain mortgage given to the grantor to J. S. Mabry or Fessie Mabry.
