

clear from any and all obstructions that may in any way endanger or interfere with the proper operation of same.

Together with the further right and privilege to take from the Laurel Creek all available water.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the right of way to be used for the construction and maintenance of the water lines shall extend over a strip of land ten (10') feet in width, beginning in the center of Reedy River in line of property of Henry P. Willimon and running thence in a Southeasterly direction approximately five hundred seventy-four (574') feet to a point in Laurel Creek.

This easement and right of way is in addition to an easement and right of way for a four (4") inch water line given by grantor to Blackinton Mills, Inc., by deed dated July 18, 1953, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 482, at page 432.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the grantee now plans to place a six (6") inch water line along side the four (4") inch line and it is also understood and agreed that the grantee shall have the right to add additional water pipe lines within this ten (10') foot right of way at any time in the future, provided that if any such water line is installed in the future, the grantee shall compensate grantor for any damages along said right of way resulting from the construction of such water pipe line.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the water pump, pump house, intake crib, and catch basin shall be placed in the same approximate location as that shown on a plat prepared by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, in June, 1953, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book EE, at page 29, and that the dam across Laurel Creek shall be located not more than fifteen (15') feet Southwest of the intake crib, and shall be no higher than sixteen (16") inches.
