CHARTER
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

C. S. MACLIN and ETTA S. MACLIN
both of
Greenville, S. C.

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did on the 30th day of December, 19 60, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is WHITE HORSE LAUNDERAMA, INC..

THIRD: That the principal place of business is White Horse Road, GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to operate automatic laundries, launderettes; to operate automatic coin devices; to buy, sell, trade, develop, improve, lease and otherwise deal in real estate or personal property, including the power to give or take real estate mortgages or chattel mortgages and/or notes for general financing or as security for the balance due on property; and generally transact all business as may be permitted under the existing laws of which may hereafter be conferred upon such corporation by operation of law.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-eight Thousand (\$28,000.00)-----Dollars payable in cash or equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred eighty (280) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)-----Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 24th day of December, 19 60, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: C. S. Maclin and Etta S. Maclin

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, C. S. Maclin
as Vice-President, Etta S. Maclin ; as Secretary, Etta S. Maclin
as Treasurer, C. S. Maclin

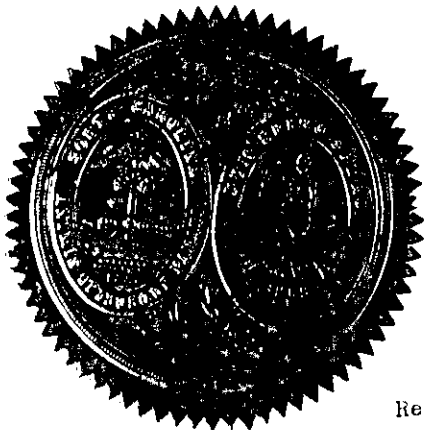
NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
