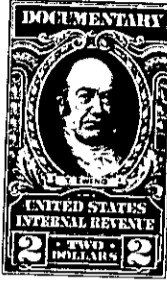
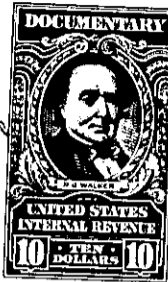

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Chestnut Hills No. 1, Inc.

and having its principal place of business at Greenville in the State of South Carolina for and in consideration

of the sum of Thirteen Thousand, Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars,

to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee hereinafter named (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Furman Middleton, Jr., his heirs and assigns forever

All that piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the eastern side of Wentworth Street, being known and designated as Lot No. 122, on plat of Chestnut Hills No. 1, which plat is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "QQ", page 83, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the eastern side of Wentworth Street, the joint corner of Lots Nos. 122 and 124, which point is 85 feet from the intersection of said Street and Farmington Road; thence with said Street, N. 33-17 E. 47.9 feet to a point; thence continuing N. 31-47 E. 25 feet to a point; thence S. 65-02 E. 162.8 feet to a point; thence S. 34-03 W. 75 feet to a point; thence N. 64-12 W. 34.8 feet to a point; thence N. 64-0 W. 125 feet to the point of beginning.
