All those lots of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina,
on the Northern side of East Faris Road, in the City of Greenville,
being shown as Lots 10, 12 and the Western one-half of Lot 14, as
shown on Plat of the Goddard McPherson property, as devised April 16,
1959 and are described together as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northern side of East Faris Road, 370.4
feet East from Augusta Street, at the corner of Lot 8, and running
thence with the line of said lot, N. 26-14 W. 138.9 feet to an iron
pin in the line of Lot 7; thence with the lines of Lots 7 and 9,
N. 55-55 E. 128.75 feet to an iron pin in the center of Lot 14;
thence S. 26-14 E. 156.1 feet to an iron pin on East Faris Road;
thence with the Northern side of said road, N. 63-45 W. 127.5 feet
to the Beginning Corner.

Being one of the lots acquired by the Grantor and the Grantees under
the Will of Blanche H. McPherson, recorded in Apartment 697 at File
8, Office of the Probate Judge for Greenville County, and it is the
purpose of this deed to vest in the Grantees the one-fourth interest
of the Grantor in the same interest as the property now owned by the
Grantees, namely: One-third of my one-fourth to Randolph Harrison
McPherson and one-third of my one-fourth to John Alexander McPherson, Jr.
