

go in and upon that tract of land situate in Saluda Township, in the said County and State, described as follows:

THE right of way to be acquired shall be seventy-five (75) feet in width during construction but the width of the permanent right of way shall be fifty (50) feet measured twenty-five (25) feet from the center of said pipe line or lines, in, upon, and through the property of Virginia N. Chadwick and A. L. Chadwick Estate, as shown on a plat prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, February 14, 1959, labeled property of Virginia Chidrick, which plat is attached to and made a part of the Notice of Condemnation.

The location of the center of the said pipe line or lines as the said pipe line or lines pass through the property of Virginia N. Chadwick and A. L. Chadwick Estate according to said plat will be as follows:

Entering the Northern boundary line of the property of Virginia N. Chadwick and A. L. Chadwick Estate at a point approximately 260 feet in a Northwest direction from the West bank of the North Saluda River at Station 193 + 02.6 of the survey of the North Saluda River Pipe Lines and runs thence through the property of Virginia N. Chadwick and A. L. Chadwick Estate, S. 23-30 W., 986.8 feet to Station 202 + 89.4 of the survey which point is in the Southern boundary line of the Virginia N. Chadwick and A. L. Chadwick Estate tract at a point 94.6 feet in a Northwestern direction from the West bank of the North Saluda River.

The Property affected by this right of way is the same conveyed to A. L. Chadwick and Virginia N. Chadwick by deed of H. B. Gosnell, dated November 24, 1944, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 269, page 316. The said A. L. Chadwick subsequently died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law the landowners named in the within Notice of Condemnation, record of administration of his estate being had at Apartment 615, File 55, Office of the Judge of Probate, Greenville County, S. C;

and to construct and maintain in, upon and through said premises, in a proper manner, a pipe line or lines, air vents, blow off connections, manholes and other necessary apparatus incident thereto, using the necessary appliances and machinery for such work for the purpose of conveying water through the premises above described, together with the right at all times to enter upon said premises for the purpose of inspecting said line or lines and making necessary repairs and alterations thereon, together with the right to cut away and keep clear of said pipe line or lines all trees and other obstructions that may in any way endanger or interfere with the proper operation of or access to the same.

It is understood and agreed that the right of way to be used under this contract during construction is to be seventy-five feet in width throughout the entire length which is approximately 986.8 feet, and the damage, which The City of Greenville, South Carolina, is to be liable for during construction, is to be confined to this
