NEW TESTAMENT HOLINESS CHURCH, INC.

which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 14th day of  
January, A. D. 1965, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That, at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That, the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, nor for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville News-Piedmont, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, Said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST: Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed Corporation is NEW TESTAMENT HOLINESS CHURCH, INC.

THIRD: The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is to establish churches and conduct religious and evangelistic work. In the event of dissolution the residual assets of this organization will be turned over to another organization which is, itself exempt from Federal Income Tax as an organization described in Section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or to the federal, state or local government.
