

chains to a rock X; thence N. 9 W. 3.96 chains to a persimmon; thence N. 58 E. 15^{3/4} chains to a pin X; thence N. 37 E. 22.80 chains to a chestnut X; thence N. 2 W. 3.25^{2/5} to a Poplar on a branch; thence down said branch following the meanders thereof as a line, in a general direction approximating S. 56^{1/2} W. about 19.43 to a Hickory X in Thomas Barton's or M. B.
