The premises covered by this lease are (A) that lot of land, and

(B) that right of way at the plant of the Lessor located near Greenville

in Greenville County, South Carolina, described as follows:

- (A) That lot of land 50.0 feet by 50.0 feet as outlined and enclosed in red on print of Duke Power Company Substation Lot and Transmission Line dated June 17, 1970, File No. 1-565, copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; including the right to construct and maintain the Delivery Bent indicated on the attached print with necessary connections; also including the right of way for access purposes between said lot and the public road or highway.
- The right, privilege and easement of constructing, maintaining and operating in a proper manner, with poles, wires, guys and other apparatus and appliances, a line for the purpose of transmitting power by electricity along and over the property of the Lessor, BEGINNING at Station 0+00; thence N 45° 11' W 190.1 feet to Station 1+90.1 located on the lot line of lot described in (A) above as shown by red line on attached print; together with the right at all times to enter upon said property for the purpose of constructing, operating, inspecting and maintaining said electric line, together with the right to keep said line clear for a distance of 34 feet on each side of the center line of same of all trees, structures and other objects of any kind which might in any way endanger or interfere with the proper construction, maintenance and operation of said line; with the right at all times to cut away or trim all trees beyond said 34 feet distance which, if they should fall or be blown or cut down, might strike said line or any portion of same.
