WHEREAS, Mattie B. Cox died intestate on the 1st day of September, 1971 owning and possessing certain real estate located in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and

in the State aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said  
CLAUDE M. COX:

All that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Butler Township, County and State aforesaid being shown and designated as Tract #4 on that certain plat of Carolina Engineering & Surveying Co. dated October, 1961 and recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Plat Book ZZ, at Page 127, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a point on E. Butler Road (formerly Mauldin-Pelham Road), and running in a Southeasterly direction for a distance of 321.5 feet to an iron marker; thence in a Northeasterly direction for a distance of 90.0 feet to an iron marker; thence in a Northwesterly direction for a distance of 300.0 feet to an iron marker; thence along the right-of-way of E. Butler Road for a distance of 100.0 feet to the point of beginning. This being a portion of the property conveyed to L. M. Cox by Deed of The Norwood National Bank dated October 17, 1925, recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Vol. 116, at Page 62.

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
