which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 4th day of

March, A. D. 1974, file with Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That, at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That, the said organization holds, or desires to hold property in common for Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, nor for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville Piedmont, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, Said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST: Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed Corporation is

SOUTH CAROLINA SOCIETY OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS, INC.

THIRD: The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is 410 Churchill Circle, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is (A) To encourage, develop and provide educational programs for those persons interested in the field of emergency care; (B) To advance the science, technology, ethics and art of the Emergency Medical Technician profession through institutes, meetings, lectures, publications and other materials. (C) To promote cooperation between emergency care personnel and the medical profession, hospitals, service companies, industry, governmental organizations and other agencies interested in emergency care and transportation of the sick and injured; (D) To establish and maintain a central bureau for information and assistance for Emergency Medical Technicians in the State.
