The Trust Indenture, dated November 19, 1971, which is between James L. Faircloth, Jr., David Warren Faircloth, Ava Arminda Faircloth Blazi, and Martha F. Bullock, grantors, and Martha F. Bullock, Trustee, specifically authorized the Trustee to convey any portion or all of the interest in the property conveyed in trust to the Trustee in the deed recorded in Deeds Book 931, Page 149 to such person or persons and upon such terms and conditions as any two or more of the grantors may direct in writing, with the further provision that no purchaser or other person dealing with the Trustee shall be required to inquire whether any act of the Trustee is done pursuant to the direction of the grantors and that no purchaser or other person dealing with the Trustee be required to see to the application of any funds or other consideration disbursed to the Trustee.

The grantors herein do hereby execute this deed for the purposes of conveying title to the grantees in the real property described above and of manifesting and ratifying their direction to the Trustee under the Trust Indenture, dated November 19, 1971, to execute this deed.
