

On the South Side of Jamesons Mill Creek and
 some on the branches of said Creek beginning on a
 black oak John McClure old line or mark No. w
 25 Ch 70 to a black Oak thence a long said line
 N. 25 W to a small white oak Gentrys old corner thence
 a long said line to a conditional corner on a sweet gum
 in a hollow thence up the said hollow to the fork
 thence taking the Ridge marked on a sawer wood
 and on a chestnut oak and with the said two trees to
 George Belvs line on a stake thence a long said line
 to the beginning it being part of a survey for Wm
 blaton containing one hundred acres be the same
 more or less Together with all and singular the rights
 liberties hereditaments and appurtenances to the prem-
 ises belonging belonging or in any wise incident to
 have and to hold all and singular the aforesaid
 premises unto the said Barrett, his heirs and assigns
 forever against my self my heirs and a gainst every
 other person whomsoever lawfully lawfully claiming
 or to claim the same or any part thereof witness
 my hand and seal March 9th 1822 signed sealed
 and acknowledged in the presence of us the

notary Henry Prince for ^{his}
 William Barrett ^{his} Edward Maddox

South Carolina. Personally came ^{up} ^{for me} ⁱⁿ ^{the}
 Greenville District of the Justice for D. District Henry
 Prince and made oath that he was present and saw
 Edward Maddox sign seal and deliver the within deed
 of conveyance to and for the use and purpose within
 mentioned and that William Barrett was a subscribing
 witness with him self to the due execution of the
 same Sworn to and subscribed before me this 15 day
 of January 1823.
