of One thousand and ninety five dollars have granted bargained  
Sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release  
unto the said James Jones all that tract or plantation of Land contain-  
ing Two hundred and ninety five acres be the same more or less begin-  
ning On Stake on the fence and running N. 5 E. 23 to a stake thence N.  
5 W. to a Stake thence N 70. W. 24. 50 to a Stake thence S. 45. W. 8. 50 to  
poplar thence W. 8 to Stake by maple thence S. 22. W. 18. to an oak  
thence S. 36 E. 7 to a gum on dam thence S. 45 W to post oak thence S.  
E. to Red oak thence S. 85. W. 20. to Stake on Thompson thence S. 65 E. 22. 50 to Red  
Oak down thence S. 25. W. 8. 50 to Stake thence S 65. E. 8. 50 to post oak thence S.  
W. 21. 50 to post oak down on the Greenville road thence S. 38. E. 13 to Stake thence S.  
to Stake thence N. 25. E. 36. to Stake by a pine thence to the beginning on fence it  
Being a part of a tract of land originally granted to Peter Swinney con-  
taining Six hundred and forty acres granted his Excellency William  
Maulby the sixth day of March 1786 and a part of a tract originally  
granted to James Harrison surveyed 12 of January in the year 1792  
it Being a part a tract of land containing five hundred acres originally  
granted to Andrew Thompson surveyed for him the 6 of September  
1788 and I do hereby bind my self my heirs Executors and Administrators  
to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises  
unto the said James Jones his heirs and assigns against my self my  
Heirs and against every person who may lawfully claim  
or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my hand and  
Seal this the 12 of January 1826 and in the fiftyeth year of the inde-  
pendence of the United States of America.
