

Common Pleas at November Term Eighteen Hundred and Twenty Four confirmed the said Return of the Commissioners, and ordered that Lands of which the said John Blasingame and seized should be sold at public Auction at the Court House by the Sheriff of the said district in the separate lots or tracts as laid off and divided by the said Commissioners, reference being had to their General Plat aforesaid on Tuesday after the first Monday in January thence next ensuing after public notice of forty days. Now know ye that in obedience to the said order of the Court of Common Pleas I the said Nimrod Underwood Sheriff as aforesaid on the day appointed in the said Order after giving the notice required did expose to Sale at Greenville Court House One Lot Tract and parcel of Land being part of the said Lands of John Blasingame dec^d. containing Two Hundred and Ninety acres (219) more or less Situate lying and being in the district of Greenville aforesaid on Saluda River and bounded as follows, to the West on lands surveyed for Langford to the S.W. on Reubin Garrison to the S.E. on William Wickliffe's land to the N.E. on M. Clauhauns land to the N. on Geo^e. Soups land Beginning on Lightwood Stake on M. Clauhauns land running S 13. E. 14. 50 to a chestnut stump 3+ 0. m. thence S. 12. W. 78. 50 to a Stake 3+ thence N. 19. Bunson paid or Secured to be paid I the said Nimrod Underwood Sheriff as aforesaid have Granted bargained and sold and by these Presents do Grant bargain and sell unto the said Enoch B. Bunson his Heirs and assigns forever, the said tract Lot and Parcel of Land together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, and all the Estate right Title interest and Claims whatsoever which the said John Blasingame dec^d. of right of in and to the same. To have and to hold the said Tract Lot and parcel of Land with the appurtenances unto the said Enoch B. Bunson his Heirs and assigns forever, as fully as I the said Nimrod Underwood might or ought to Grant bargain and sell the same by virtue of the writ of Partition, the return thereunto and the order of Court of Common Pleas aforesaid.
