 William Butler of Greenville District in the state aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and
 released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Dr. William
 Butler all that certain tract piece or parcel of land situated lying and being in the Distr-
 ict of Greenville and state aforesaid on the head waters of Laurel Creek waters of
 Ruddy River including part of Pike's Mountain, beginning at a chert corner near
 the road leading to said mountain and running thence fifty five chains till it intersects
 the old line of Mrs. Pike's tract S. 80. E thence S. 54. E 5 ch. 60. links to a Spanish Oak corner, thence
 S. 74. W. 26 ch. to a pine thence N. 81. W. 20. ch. to a post oak thence N. 46. W. 22. ch. to a red
 oak and thence N. 31. E thence chains to the beginning corner containing fifty eight acres
 be the same more or less and being a part of of a tract originally platted for 105
 Acres but on a recalculation found to contain one hundred and three acres.
