State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I William McCullough heir of David McCullough deceased of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of two hundred and twenty five dollars to me in hand paid by William Dorherty of the District aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and acquit the said William Dorherty Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Dorherty his heirs Executors adm^{rs} and assigns for ever a certain tract of Land containing one hundred and fifty acres originally granted to James Mt. and signed by his Excellency Charles Pinckney on the second day of February one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine situate and lying in Greenville District on the Horse join creek waters of Enore River Beginning at a Post & running to 40 chains to a post oak 3x thence S. 25. E. 49. chains to a hickory 3x thence N. 80. E. 18 chains to a stake 3x thence due N. 55. chains to the beginning corner containing one hundred and fifty acres as per Plat. Together with all and singular the rights, members, tenements, to hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto the said William Dorherty his heirs and assigns for ever To have and to hold use occupy possess and enjoy the same with every part and parcel thereof with all and singular the premises tenements hereditaments thereunto belonging unto the said William Dorherty his heirs Executors adm^{rs} & assigns for ever And I do hereby bind myself to warrant and forever defend the Right and title from myself my heirs Ex^{rs} adm^{rs} and from every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30 day of December 1821. signed sealed and delivered in presence of us Just.
