 heirs and assigns forever against the said William Sinsley or his assigns  
 and against the lawfull claim or demands of any other person or persons  
 whatsoever in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
 this 17<sup>th</sup> day of July 1806 and thirty first of americans Independence
