

The State of South Carolina & Know all men by these presents, that I Tully Greenville District & Bolling of the State and District aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to me paid and in consideration of the natural love and affection I have for my son Thaddeus C. Bolling of the said State and District aforesaid have given granted and released and by these presents grant give and release unto the said Thaddeus C. Bolling a plantation and tract of Land laying in the State aforesaid a part in Greenville and a part in Laurence District on the South fork of Rabunns Creek, it being a tract of Land that Tully F. Sullivan & Co bought of James Kellit (and known as the Widow Kellit Place) then sold by the said Tully F. Sullivan & Co and bought by the said Berry & Bolling Beginning on a stake on the bank of the south fork of Rabunns Creek thence running S 83 W 35 to a stake bounded by Wm Boyce's Land thence N 45 E 11 to a Red Oak & thence west 23.50 to a post oak (Down) on the old Indian boundary line by the said William Boyce thence North along the said boundary line 60 to a stake bounded by lands that Robert Peden lately bought from J. P. Peden and Alexander P. eden thence East 22 to a stake on the south bank of the said Rabunns Creek bounded by Robert Peden's Land thence down the meanders of said Creek to the beginning containing two Hundred and fifty one acres be the same more or less" Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular
