

McBee, their Trustee Executor Administrators and assign to the only proper use and behoof of the said James McBee and the lawful heirs of her Body her Trustee Executor Administrators Assigns forever, and I the said Walter Austin do give all and singular the said Negro Girl and her increase if any to the said James McBee during her natural life and then to the lawful heirs of her natural Body their Trustee Executor Administrators and Assigns, against with the said Walter Austin my Executors and Administrators and all and every other person or persons what soever, shall and well warrant and forever defend by their persons of all and singular which said said Negro Girl I the said Walter Austin have put the said James McBee in full possession of the said Negro Girl Heuman in the name of the whole premises hereby granted. Townes Esquire Commissioner in Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House on the one part and Abraham Plythe on the other part. Whereas Abraham Plythe did on the 26th day of June A.D. 1837 file his Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity for Greenville District in the said State against David Plythe Administrator of Thomas Plythe dec'd. Hercules Tally & Wife either & other the heirs and representatives of the said Thomas Plythe as by reference to the Registry of the said Court will more fully appear, stating among other things that Thomas Plythe late of Greenville District died the day of May preceding intestate leaving a large Real Estate and praying for a writ of Partition to divide said Estate among those entitled thereto or for an order of the Court to sell
