 Greenville District Gordon of the District aforesaid for and in consideration
 of the love and kindness which I have and bear unto my grand son John
 T. Cooper son of my daughter Martha Cooper and also in consideration
 of the sum of one dollar to me paid by the said John T. Cooper at and
 before the sealing and delivery hereof have given granted and confirmed
 and by these presents do give grant and confirm unto the said John
 T. Cooper a certain bay horse which I bought from a Wagoner at
 Pilas Holloways. reserving to myself notwithstanding the exclusive
 controll and management of the said horse untill he the said John
 T. Cooper arrives at the age of twenty one years and should he the
 said John T. Cooper die previous to his coming of age the whole and
 sole right to the said horse is to revert to myself. In testimony whereof

The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Barton
 of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum
 of Four Hundred dollars to me paid by Joseph Barton of the State and District
 aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do
 grant bargain sell and release unto the said Joseph Barton all that tract
 or parcel of land situate in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid at the
 head of the sink hole fork of Tiger River Beginning at a Chestnut near Edmu-
 nd Bendins white Oak corner and running thence North Eighty chain to a Ches-
 nut thence West to the head of a Branch west of where Thomas Bowers now
 lies running thence south with said branch to Michael Prewitts line thence
 East and to follow said line with its different courses untill it intersects with
 Richard Wards line thence on Wards line to the River thence down the River
 to the mouth of a Branch thence due south untill it crosses the Original line
 as Sillets Mountain thence East to the Beginning corner containing by estima-
 tion Four Hundred Acres be the same more or less. The same being a part of a
 tract of land granted to bushman Edsow bearing date the seven teenth of
 May Seventeen Hundred and Eighty seven together with all and singular the
 rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
