thirty three dollars 33⁰⁰ now to secure the payment of said Debt
I have bargained and sold and by these presents to bargain
and sell unto the said William Deupont the following property
that is three feather Beds. Bedsteads and furniture one Cup Board
and contents. 12 Old Split bottom Chairs. 2 tables. 1 Loom & apparatus
one thousand lb pickled Pork. One Gray Mule. One small mare and
one small colt, about twenty five head of Hogs. ten Head of Sheep
one Still. ten Head of Cattle. Two thousand bundles fodder. about sixty
Barrels corn. Eight Ploughs. Hoes and three axes which said property
I warrant and defend unto the said William Deupont from
myself and my Heirs and from every person whomsoever lawfully
claiming the same or any part thereof. But it is agreed and
