 Daniel Mosteller South Carolina Know all men by these presents
 Greenville District that I John Mc Delany for &
 in Consideration of the Sum of Two Hundred Dollars paid to me in
 hand by Daniel Mosteller. I have this day granted bargain sold
 & by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
 Daniel Mosteller a certain plantation or parcel of land containing
 One Hundred Acres be the same more or less. Beginning on a
 lightwood stake a corner of Jordan Holcombes land and running
 thence W 44 to a stake thence S 26 E 51 to a Red Oak thence N 15
 50 to a pine thence N 30 E 29 50 to a Chestnut thence to the
 beginning. Together with all and singular the rights members
 Hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging. I
 do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors & administrators
 to warrant & forever defend the above mentioned premises
 unto the sd Daniel Mosteller his heirs & assigns forever from
 the claims of all persons lawfully claiming the same
 or any part thereof in witness whereof I have hereunto
 put my hand this twenty fifth day of January One
 thousand eight hundred and forty One, signed sealed
 and delivered in the presence of us.
