Hawkins his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

Witness my hand and seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, in the 78<sup>th</sup> year of the independence of the United States of America.
