

and enjoy respectively the Negro slaves hereby conveyed, in trust for him, ^{and his heirs} to receive and enjoy the profits arising therefrom according to the terms of this deed, and at his death shall hold the same in trust for the parties to whom this trust shall succeed upon the same terms and conditions, and if at any time either or any of the said slaves, become unmanageable, or from necessity or other causes, it should be deemed prudent, and desirable to sell any or either of said slaves, the said trustee shall with the mutual consent of the party entitled to the trust estate in such slaves, proceed to sell such slave or slaves and convert the proceeds thereof, in such property real or personal as the parties with the acquiescence of the said trustee shall determine upon, which property shall be held upon the terms and for the same persons, trusts uses, and purposes, as the slaves from the proceeds of which such property may be purchased were held. In the event that the trustee of a said should die or shall desire to relinquish his trust another may be appointed in his place, and stead by the mutual consent of the trustee yet in office, and the other party to this deed, which trustee when so appointed, shall be substituted to all the rights held by his predecessor, under this deed.
