This deed includes all the land within this boundary excepting except a piece of land for side running parallel with R. R. which is deeded to the company, and if not used by the company to return to M. Garrison. Together with all the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said M. Garrison, his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors, administrators so named, and forever defende all and singular the said premises unto the said M. Garrison his heirs executors and administrators against myself, my heirs and every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
