Know all men by these presents that
James G. McClurg of District of Greenville

in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the natural
love and affection I have and bear to my son James H. McClurg
of the Said State and district above mentioned have given
granted bargained sold conveyed and released and by these
presents do give grant bargain sell convey and release unto the
said James H. McClurg his heirs and assigns forever all that east
or part of a tract of land being a part of the tract of land now live on
containing of One hundred acres of land more or less situate
lying and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid
on the waters of the reedy fork a tributary of reedy river being the
west of the tract of land now live on which was deeded to me
from Margret McClurg to gether with all and singular the writes
members hereditaments and appertaining to the said tract of land
belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to
hold all and singular the said premises unto the said James H.
McClurg his heirs and assigns for ever and I bind myself my
heirs executors administrators and assigns to warrant and forever
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said James
H. McClurg his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and
against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to
claim the same or any part thereof

I further give convey and deliver unto my
said son and his heirs One negro boy named Ben One
man One Cow and Calf One bed and furniture to have and
to hold the said negro boy man and Cow and Calf
bed and furniture unto the said James H. McClurg and
his heirs forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this 8th of April A.D. 1836
and in the Eightieth year of the Sovereignty and
Independence of the United States of America
