 This indenture made the third day of September in the year

of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty between William Mc Thomas Esquire Commissioner of the Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the State of the one part, and Samuel Mc Green of the other part, Whereas George K Burgess and Patience his wife on or about the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine exhibited their Bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against James Ward Susan Ward et al for the partition and sale of the real estate of Henry Rains deceased, and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at July Term in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the said Land should be sold at public auction by the Commissioner of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their decenal order as by referance thereto in the registry of the said Court well appear, and the said William Mc Thomas as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly advertised the said Land for sale by Public outcry on the 3 day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty did then openly and publicly and according to the custom of auctions sell and dispose of the said Land below described unto the said Samuel Green for Eight hundred dollars being at that price the highest bidder for the same. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said William Mc Thomas as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said decree and in consideration of the sum of Three dollars paid him by the said Samuel Mc Green the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath
