A contract made between R E Compton & George Hagens, Compton agrees on his part to repair the house on his place known as the Longford House by under pinning & patching the roof so as to make it comfortable & to build a garden fifty feet square & to let the said Hagens have the use of the said house & garden with the privilege of firewood & water for twelve months from the first day of September 1860 So said Hagens agrees to pay the said Compton at the end of said time twenty four dollars it is further agreed between the said, that the said Hagens has the Liberty of remaining in the said house & having the garden with all the above named privileges as long as he may wish by paying the said Compton twenty four
