have for my Nephew G. McRobertson as well as in consideration of
one dollar to me in hand paid have granted bargained sold and releas
ed and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the
said G. McRobertson a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the
County and State aforesaid on the branch waters of Muck Creek of South
Tyger river. Beginning on a poplar on the North side of a branch on
Joseph Mulleners line running a west course to a Persimmon corner
on said branch thence on west to a Chestnut oak near the top of
the hill thence South to a black oak corner thence east to a small
black oak thence N. E. to Locust corner thence east to a large Poplar
thence still a east course to a Rock corner on Joseph Mulleners
line thence North with said Mulleners line to the beginning corner
containing thirty acres more or less. Reserving to my self for my own use
and benefit during life with free use of all water a small house
and lot around it and also the apple orchard on said premises to
be my own right and property during life & at my death to belong
to the said G. McRobertson his heirs or assigns and the said G. Mc
Robertson does agree to pay the said James Jackson one third of
all the produce raised on the above named premises during the said
Jacksens life & no longer together with all and singular the rights
Members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
