 Hundred and fifty Dollars to me in hand paid the
 receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge I do grant
 sell and convey unto Rowlin Sudduth of the State
 aforesaid and County of Greenville a certain tract or
 parcel of Land Situate and lying in said County of
 Greenville on the North fork of Elisha Thompson
 Beaver dam creek containing Fifty Acres more or
 less Bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at a stone
 corner on the Rutherford Road on Martha E. Peavers
 line thence down that line to the creek thence a straight
 line up the creek to a stone corner thence west course
 to the Rutherford Road on the line of the Benson tract
 of Land thence down the Rutherford Road to the
 Beginning. Together with all and singular the
 premises above mentioned and released unto the
 said Rowlin Sudduth his heirs and assigns forever
 clear of all incumbrance and I the said Lemuel
 Page do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors
 Administrators and assigns to warrant and
 forever defend the above mentioned premises against
 the lawful claims of all persons forever
