I S. J. Douthett Judge of Probate for the County of Greenville in the said State and presiding at the hearing of the petition of W. W. Harrison of Henry Harrison John L. Mauldin and Gullie Harrison, on or about the 5th day of October 1875 did exhibit their petition in the Court of Probate at Greenville Court House in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid against Thomas S. Harrison and Anna M. Harrison, and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the first day of December 1875 when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order a Judge and Decree that the tract of land belonging to the Estate of Nancy Harrison deceased hereinafter mentioned and described should be vested in Anna M. Harrison at the sum of Two thousand six hundred Dollars the appraised value of the same.
