the said Coleman the right to use any timber
on the place for the improvement of the plantation
she also gives the said Coleman the right to
move any fencing on the farm where he sees
proper the said Coleman takes care of the said
farm just as it was his own the said Coleman
is to have garden potato patch cane patch and
cotton patch for family use free of rent

Montgomery in the State aforesaid, have granted bar-
gained sold and released, and by these presents do
grant bargain sell, and release, unto the said S. L.
Montgomery a certain tract piece or parcel of
land situate in the State and County aforesaid con-
taining two and one fourth acres (2 1/4) be the
same more or less and bounded as follows viz
Beginning on a Rock thence the old line between
S. L. Montgomery and Louisa Watson S 10 1/2 W
13.10 to rock thence N 48 W 4.30 to Rock thence
N 29 E 11.25 to the beginning corner.

Together with all and singular the rights members
hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said
premises belonging, or in any wise incident or
appertaining; To have and to hold, all and
singular the premises before mentioned unto
the said S. L. Montgomery his heirs and assigns
forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves
our heirs executors and administrators, to war-
rant and forever defend all and singular
the said premises, unto the said S. L. Montgom-
ery his heirs and assigns, against ourselves and
our heirs, lawfully claiming, or to claim, the
same, or any part thereof.
