Cox, To	Deed to 49 acres	State of South Carolina County of Greenville Know all men by these present that whereas James Cox late of South Township Greenville County and State aforesaid, departed this life intestate and un- married about the 22nd day of September A. D. 1868 sized and possessed of a certain tract of land con- taining about two hundred and forty eight and one fourth acres, which has since remained in the possession of his widow Sarah Cox, and whereas the said James Cox deceased left surviving him at his decease at law and distribute his widow Sarah Cox, and his first sons Samuel M. Cox, William E. Cox, James H. Materson S. Cox and Rufanus S. Cox (now depar- ted this life intestate and unmarried on the 27th day of June A. D. 1883 all of whom are above the age of twenty one years, and whereas no partition or division of said Real Estate has ever been had and being desirous to have the same without recourse to the Courts, and whereas the said Real Estate was surveyed at the request and by the consent of all the parties in interest on 3rd day of March 1882 by James H. Dickson N. B. and by him cut into six dif- ferent tracts as follows to wit: Tract No 1 containing fifty acres, Tract No 2 containing forty nine acres Tract No 3 containing forty two and three quarters acres, Tract No 4, containing forty two and a half acres, Tract No 5 containing forty one acres, and Tract No 6 containing twenty three acres - each tract having the notes and bounds courses and dis- tances as shown by the plat of said survey mark- ed No 1, No 2, No 3, No 4, No 5, and No 6.
