Know ye that in consideration
of your integrity and skill full former is hereby given to you
to take the renunciation of Mary E. W. Bee wife of Jarvis
A. W. Bee of Lincoln County in the state of North Carolina
of her dower in the premises described in the deed from
Jarvis A. W. Bee to Alexander W. Bee dated day of
conveying one half of a tract of land situate in the City of
Greenville on both sides of Ruddy River upon which is
situated the house of the said Alexander W. Bee the wa-
ter Power known as Cox Lower and the saw mill the Car-
penter shop occupied by W. Cagle and the ware house occu-
pied by J. L. Turner being all of the land avowed by the said
Jarvis A. W. Bee and the said Alexander W. Bee within the
City of Greenville except that tract to the Campground
Mill and more particularly described in the deed hereto annex-
ed For the purpose you will cause the said Mary E. W. Bee to
appear before you and you will examine her privately and
separately apart from all other persons and if upon such
examination she shall fully declare that she does fully
voluntarily and without any compulsion dread or fear of
any person or persons whatsoever renounce release and
forever relinquish to Alexander W. Bee his heirs and assigns
you all her interest and estate and also all her rights and
claim of dower of in and to all and singular the premises
described and conveyed in the deed aforesaid Then you shall
take the same to be true and valid.

nation or aforesaid which certificate an item be attested by you
hand and seal and by you shall annex to this writ and un-
ing certified under your hands and seals the due execution
of this writ and verified the same by the oath of one or more
before named Magistrate who in and to which by the Law of your

may be properly authenticated. You shall carefully return
this writ together with your proceedings therein to the Clerk
of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for
Greenville County in the State first aforesaid to be duly
