WHEREAS the undersigned, Edward Croft, Florida L. Croft, Hattie P. Croft, Charlotte M. Croft, and E.E. McNeill, together with T.O. Croft, G.W. Croft and F.L. Stone, were the owners as tenants in common of the real estate hereinafter described, and being desirous that the same should be partitioned among the said parties according to their respective rights, did enter into a written agreement, stipulating that the said real estate should be sold at public auction to the highest bidder in front of the Court House in the City of Greenville, State of South Carolina, between the legal hours of sale on Monday, the 7th. day of December, 1903.
