KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That I, Chas. W. Hawkins County of Greenville in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of twenty five dollars to me paid by the Paris Mountain Water Company a corporation organized under the Laws of South Carolina and doing business in the State aforesaid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and do hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns a right of way over a tract of land in Check-Springs, Town-ship, Greenville County and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of John W. Walker, Thomas Bridges, Henry Alewine, Matthew Goodlett, length of line 600 feet; width of right of way 8 feet; for the purpose of laying their pipes or conduits, appurtenances and appliances there to, to conduct water with the privilege of entering upon the same and making such excavations, fills and levels as may be requisite and the privilege of laying such pipes or pipe or other conduits, appurtenances and appliances thereto as they may deem necessary, and making such repairs and laying other pipes or conduits appurtenances and appliances thereto as may from time to time be necessary; such pipes or conduits to be approximately located along the lines recently surveyed by the said Paris Mountain Water Company, to have and to hold such right of way and privileges for the purpose aforesaid unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns forever. the said Paris Mountain Water Company agrees to pay any future damage caused to crops or personal property due to the action of the workmen or teams in hauling over the property the bursting of said pipes, the amount of said damage to be fixed by arbitration.

WHEREAS, P. F. Capers, Ellisea A. Smythe, Lewis W. Parker, W. E. Beattie, and Edwin W. Robertson, a majority of the Board of Directors of INTER STATE TRUST COMPANY, a corporation created under and pursuant to the Laws of South Carolina, by certificate issued by the Secretary of State on the 23rd day of May, A.D. 1905. HAVE CERTIFIED over their signature, Resolutions authorizing in behalf of the aforesaid Corporation an increase of the Capital Stock, (authorized and set forth in the certificate aforesaid) to the sum of One Hundred and twenty-five Thousand Dollars; which Resolutions were adopted pursuant to law, at a meeting of the stock-holders of the aforesaid Corporation, of which thirty days published notice was given, which notice stated the purpose of the aforesaid meeting; and further, that said Resolutions were adopted by a two-thirds vote, and that in all respect there has been complied with the provisions of Section 1851, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1902, and all amendments thereto. Gantt, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority vested by Chapter XLVII of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1902, and amendments thereto, and all Acts or parts of Acts thereto enabling, have this day endorsed across the face of the aforesaid Certificate of Incorporation or original Charter, authority of increase, as aforesaid and I hereby certify that the requirements of Law for said increase will have been complied with when this Certificate and the endorsement across the face of the original Charter aforesaid are acknowledged for record in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each County in which the said Corporation shall have a business office.
