in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred and forty Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by P. G. Vaughan

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said P. G. Vaughan, All that certain tract of land, situate in the County and State of South Carolina, containing one hundred and one acres, more or less, according to Survey made by Geo. E. Rogers, on September 9th 1763, bearing lines, beginning at a Turkey Oak Wooded and Corner, then S 67 10' 40.80" to a stone on road, then S 42 26' 37.15" to a stone on road, then S 77 56' 18.40" to a stone on road, then S 30 56' 30.90" to the beginning, being the same tract of land which was conveyed to my grand-mother, Jane Williams on November 29th 1824, the deed being of record in the R. M. D. Office for Greenville County in Book D. at Page 207 and which on the death of Jane Williams intestate descended to my father Lewis Williams, and his two sisters Belle and Mary, who subsequently died intestate and unmarried leaving said Lewis Williams as their sole heir, and who died intestate about seventeen years ago leaving me as his sole heir at law, and which said tract of land has been the family homestead successively of the said Jane Williams since its purchase in 1824, and then of the said Lewis Williams and his two sisters, and then of myself

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said P. G. Vaughan his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself and my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said P. G. Vaughan his

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
