 Seven and no/100 dollars, in consideration of which I hereby grant unto said Company
 its successors and assigns, the right privileges and authority to construct, operate,
 and maintain its lines of Telephone and Telegraph, including the necessary poles, wires and
 fixtures upon, over and across the property which I own or in which I have any interest in
 the County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, and upon and along the roads,
 streets or highways, adjoining the said property with the right to permit the attachments
 of the wires of any other company and the right to trim any trees along said lines so
 as to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen inches, to erect and set the necessary
 guy and braces poles and anchors and to attach thereto and to trees the necessary guy
 wires, said sum being received in full payment therefor, and with the further Right
 to cut down trees to clear line and in full payment for all damage of any nature.
