GENERAL POWER OF

its true and lawful Attorney(s)-in-Fact, with full power and authority hereby conferred in its name, place and stead, to execute, seal, acknowledge and deliver any and all bonds, undertakings, recognizances or other written obligations in the nature thereof, each not to exceed \$500,000. in amount.

and to bind the Corporation thereby as fully and to the same extent as if such bonds were signed by the President, sealed with the corporate seal of the Corporation and duly attested by its Secretary, hereby ratifying and confirming all that the said Attorney(s)-in-Fact may do in the premises.

This power of attorney is granted pursuant to Article VIII, Section 30 and 31 of By-laws of THE AMERICAN INSURANCE COMPANY adopted on the 7th day of May, 1963, and now in full force and effect.

"Article VIII, Appointment and Authority of Resident Assistant Secretaries, and Attorneys-in-Fact and Agents to accept Legal Process and Make spearances.

Section 30. Appointment. "RESOLVED, that the signature of any Vice-President, Assistant Secretary, and Resident Assistant Secretary of this Corporation, and the seal of this Corporation may be affixed or printed on any power of attorney, on any revocation of any power of attorney, or on any certificate relating thereto, by tacsimile, and any power of attorney, any revocation of any power of attorney, or certificate bearing such facsimile signature or facsimile seal shall be valid and binding upon the Corporation."

This power of attorney is also signed and sealed under and by authority of an Instrument of Authority executed on the 5th day of July, 1972 pursuant to Article VIII, Section 30 and 31, of the By-laws of THE AMERICAN INSURANCE COMPANY, and said instrument of Authority is now in full force and effect, to wit:
