until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal, and of any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ten (10) percent W. P. Gray James L. Gray besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That W. P. Moore and James L. Gray in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said W. P. Gray

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to W. P. Gray, the said.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. P. Gray, his heirs and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview Township, County of Spartanburg aforesaid, being of house and designated as Tract 9104 upon a plat of the property of W. H. G. Silvers made by J. P. S. Middle, surveyor, March 6, 1920, and having the following corners and boundaries, to wit: Beginning at a mulberry tree on a creek and running thence S. 28 E. 34.29 along line of land of J. P. Middle to a stake thence S. 28 E. 16.56 to a stake; thence S. 59 E. 13.43 to a stake; thence N. 26 E. 144.14 to a fork; thence N. 15.30 W. 31.46 along Faulkster Estate line to another fork in center of old road; thence with the center of said old road as follows, N. 58-15 W. 7.50 to a point in road; thence N. 73-30 W. 2.53 to a point in road; thence N. 25 W. 7.23 to a point in road; thence S. 70-30 W. 3.45 to a point in road; thence N. 81 W. 7.06 to a point in road; thence S. 24 W. 3.77 to point in road; thence S. 56.45 W. 3.70 to point in fork of road; thence with said road in a Southwesterly direction to point in center of bridge at creek; thence leaving said road over path in the brushy banks of said creek 6.10 to the mulberry tree, the beginning herein and containing one hundred fifteen  $\frac{4}{100}$  (115.48) acres, more or less.
