with interest thereon from date at rate of 8 per cent. per annum to be
computed and paid annually

until paid in full, all interest not paid when due bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue
thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

Five per cent besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note, to be collected as a part thereof, the same to be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof,
be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (in which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being

All those three lots of land lying just out side the corporate limits
of the city of Greenville on Hammett St. and being a part of the
Hammett Estate as shown by a plat of said lands made by W. A.
Hudson on the 14th day of May 1900 and being lots # 9, #10 and #11
and said plat. Lot # 9 fronts 100 feet on Hammett St and runs back
to an alley 190 feet and contains $4\frac{1}{100}$ acres, more or less. Lot # 10
fronts 90 feet on said Hammett St. and runs back 190 feet to said
alley and contains $4\frac{2}{100}$ acres, more or less. Lot # 11 adjoins # 10
and commences at corner of said Hammett St. and what is now
Paris Mountain St. and runs with said Paris Mountain St. 213 feet
and 9 inches to a corner of alley, now Mill St. thence with said
